

DRYER LOCATION

For satisfactory operation, your dryer should be located where the temperature is above 50° F. (10° C.).

SORT AND LOAD

Sort Clothes by Fabric Type.

- Best results are obtained when fabrics of drying loads are similar.
- Generally, clothes that have been washed together can be dried together if they were sorted properly for washing.
- If you mix various types of fabrics in your drying load, set the controls for the lighter-weight fabrics and remove when dry. Then reset for the remaining heavier fabrics.

Before operating your dryer, READ YOUR USE AND CARE BOOK. It contains valuable information about sorting and loading, drying special fabrics and loads, care of your dryer and other important topics. SEE IMPORTANT CAUTIONS AND TROUBLE-SHOOTING GUIDE ON BACK OF THIS SHEET.

Under no circumstances should any other electrical device be connected to the same circuit as your dryer.

Clean Lint Filter Each Time Dryer is Used.

DO NOT operate dryer without the lint filter in place.

• Load clothes into the dryer and close the door.

SET THE CONTROLS Refer to DRYING GUIDE below.



SELECT DESIRED DRYING TEMPERATURE.

² TURN DIAL POINTER TO DESIRED DRYING CYCLE. **START THE DRYER.** Turn START Control clockwise and release.

Opening the door during operation stops the dryer. To re-start, close the door and turn START Control.

NOTE: The DIAL POINTER settings indicated in the above table are to be used only as a guide. For example you may find at best results are obtained for certain of your fabrics by setting the DIAL POINTER to either side of the recommended settings.

DAMP DRYING CLOTHES FOR IRONING

When only a portion of a clothes load is to be damp dried, set the dial pointer in the time zone according to the drying table, and start the Dryer. After the Dryer stops, remove the clothes to be ironed then reset the dial pointer for drying of the remaining items and turn the START control.

HEARPORTANT CAUTIONS ITEMS THAT MUST NOT BE DRIED IN A DRYER DUE TO FIRE HAZARDS

- Garments that are definitely labeled, "Dry Away From Heat" must not be put into the Dryer. In addition, articles made of foam rubber, such as padded bras, rubber-coated tennis shoes and galoshes must not be dried in a dryer.
- Fabrics impregnated with flammable chemicals, such as cleaning cloths and mops saturated with wax must not be dried in your dryer. In addition, garments which have been cleaned with flammable fluids must be thoroughly cleaned and all traces of flammable fluids removed before being placed in a dryer.

FOR PERSONAL SAFETY

- As with any clothes dryer, children should never be permitted to operate it or play in it. Children should never be permitted to put household pets in the dryer.
- If yours is a gas dryer (Model 5389), it is equipped with an automatic electric ignition and does not have a pilot light. DO NOT ATTEMPT TO LIGHT WITH A MATCH.

YOUR DRYER CAN ALSO BE USED FOR DE-WRINKLING

-- Many clean, dry garments made from synthetics and syn-

thetic blends can be de wrinkled successfully without wash-

ing. Simply follow the instructions for drying Polyester Knit

fabrics.

- DO NOT OVERLOAD Garments being dried or dewrinkled should tumble freely.
- REMOVE CLOTHES IMMEDIATELY To help prevent wrinkling, remove garments from the dryer immediately at the end of the drying cycles.
- PLACE ON HANGERS Permanent Press and Polyester Knit garments look best if placed on hangers after drying.

TROUBLE-SHOOTING GUIDE

Before you call for service, check the following . . .

Problem	Possible Reasons					
Dryer won't start	Make sure cord is plugged in.					
	Check fuses and circuit breaker to make sure dryer is getting current.					
	Make sure controls are set and start switch is turned. Opening the door during operation stops the dryer. To re-start, close the door and turn the start switch					
	Make sure door is securely closed. Dryer will not run with door open.					
	Do not operate other appliances on the same electrical outlet or circuit while the dryer is operating.					
Clothes won't dry or drying time is too long	Make sure lint filter is thoroughly cleaned. Clean area under lint filter with vacuur cleaner.					
	Check all controls to make sure they are correctly set for the load you want to dry					
	 Check fuses or circuit breakers. (Most electric dryers have 2 fuses or circuit breakers.) 					
	Make sure dryer is ducted in accordance with installation instructions.					
	Make sure outside ducting is clean and free of obstructions.					
	Make sure damper in outside wall cap operates easily.					
	If flexible ducting was used, be sure it is not kinked.
