

As a part of our continuing commitment to comply with all applicable federal and state laws, GE Appliances provides the following information under the chemical-content reporting law enacted by the state of Colorado in 2022, HB 22-1345. HB 22-1345 requires the disclosure of the presence of chemicals categorized as PFAS chemicals when present in the food contact surfaces or handles of cookware. The presence of a chemical on the below list does not mean that the product is unsafe or poses a health risk.

The list provided below is a list of chemicals for which the state of Colorado requires disclosure under HB 22-1345.
